First Volunteens Opportunity Launches in Ceredigion!

Run by charity **Foothold Cymru**, funded by the Welsh Government and administered by the WCVA, Volunteens is a youth-led platform connecting 11-18 year olds with local volunteering opportunities that build skills and support communities.

Following a successful pilot in Carmarthenshire, which saw hundreds of young people take part in volunteer opportunities, **Volunteens** is now expanding into **Pembrokeshire**, **Ceredigion**, **and Powys**.

The **first ever Volunteens placement outside of Carmarthenshire**, is now live in **Cardigan, Ceredigion!** Youth charity **Area 43**, have launched an opportunity which offers young people the chance to gain real experience, learn barista skills, and be part of a supportive, welcoming team at their youth led café, Depot.

Emily Wells, who is leading the rollout of the Volunteens service for Foothold Cymru, said: "Young people want to give back to their communities and are passionate about making a positive impact. But they struggled to find accessible, youth-friendly volunteering opportunities. Volunteens bridges that gap, giving amazing organisations like Area 43 the tools to offer opportunities that benefit everyone."

Area 43, support young people in both formal and informal settings, and believe that young people have the power to change communities—making them the perfect partner to guide and support volunteers throughout their journey.

At **Area 43**, Volunteens will receive hands-on training in making coffee, taking customer orders, handling payments, and keeping the café clean and friendly. The role is designed to **build confidence**, grow practical skills, and support young people as they take their next steps.

Michelle Costigan from Area 43 said:

"At Depot, we believe in creating real opportunities for people to build confidence, learn new skills, and take meaningful steps toward employment. It's more than just training — it's about belonging, growing, and being supported every step of the way." - Michelle

This launch marks a **significant milestone** for the Volunteens project and is a fantastic opportunity for young people in **Ceredigion** to gain experience, grow their skills, and make a positive contribution to their community.
