Run by the charity Foothold Cymru, funded by the Welsh Government, and administered by WCVA, **Volunteens** is a youth-led platform connecting 11-18 year olds with local volunteering opportunities that build skills and support communities.

Following a successful pilot in Carmarthenshire—where hundreds of young people took part in volunteering opportunities—Volunteens is expanding into Pembrokeshire, Ceredigion, and Powys.

SPAN Arts has a long history of delivering community-based arts projects that appeal to all ages, so it felt like a natural fit that they would want to include the voices of young people in the planning and delivery of their events. We're delighted to welcome SPAN Arts to Volunteens!


